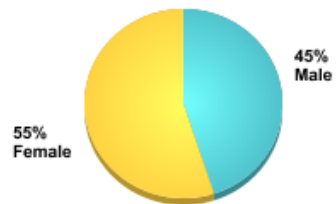

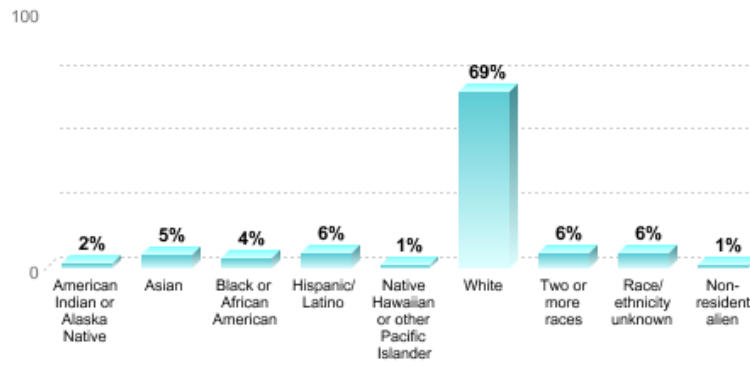
**ATTENDANCE STATUS**



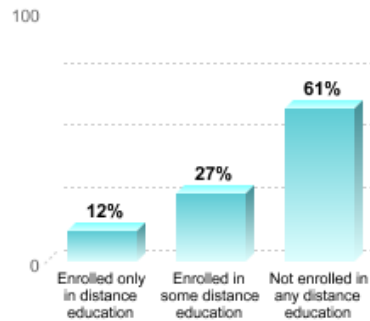
**STUDENT GENDER**

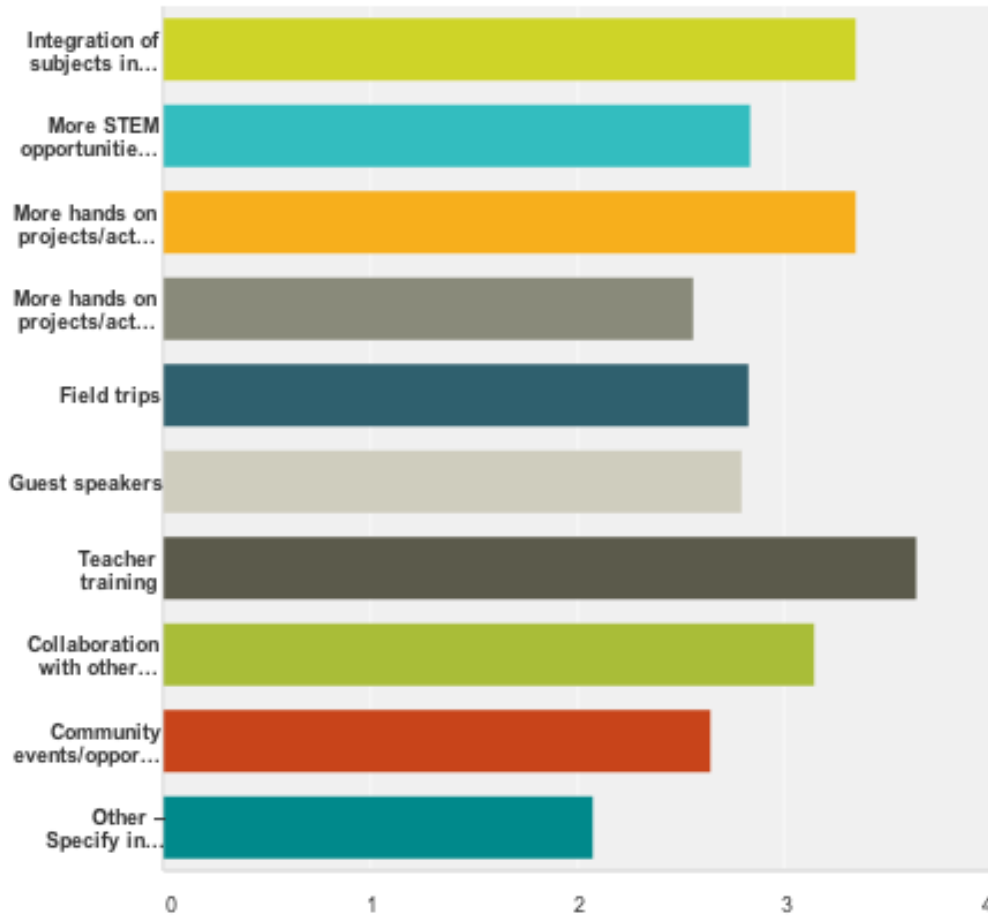

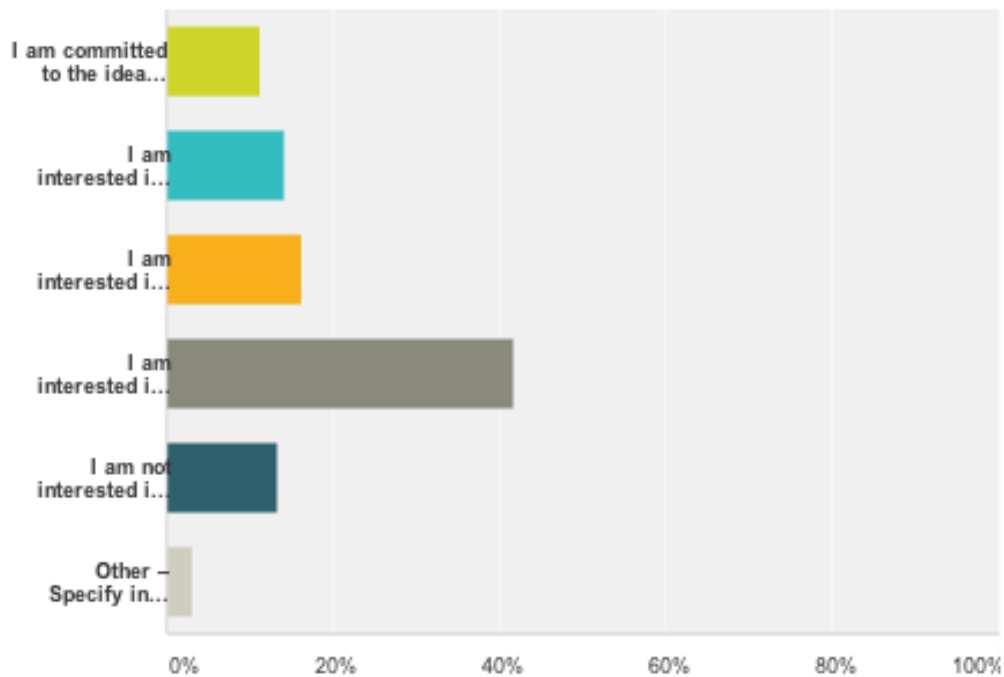
